Welcome to ColumbaFest 2023!

ColumbaFest is a festival held on the anniversary of the death of St Columba, the holy man who came from Ireland to settle on the island of lona and, in time, established the religious settlement there

Columba christianised Scotland; and the mission work of his followers spread out from there to reach parts of central and southern Europe.

The festival explores themes from Columba's life, such as learning, mission, exile, prayer, spirituality and social engagement.

This year has a particular emphasis on what we are gathering from all we experienced with Covid and the lockdowns; the lingering fragility and unprocessed grief; the unseen struggles and changed-forevers.

Our gentle festival day will be a shared journey by stages, marked in story, symbol, silence and song.

Jane Bentley (percussion), Suzanne Butler (fiddle, guitar) and Margaret McLarty (guitar, banjo, piano) balance fiery protest songs by re-imagined hymns and their own new material.

They have recorded songs for BBC Scotland's 'Reflections at the Quay' and BBC One's 'Songs of Praise' from the island of Iona.

At the Edinburgh Fringe on 21st August, in St. Andrew's and St. Georges West Church, they will be launching their **debut album 'Siskin Green'**; songs springing from contemporary and historical women's voices – reaching out beyond the boundaries of religion and dogma, to embrace the joys and concerns of our daily lives. 


Accessibility
