Alongside our daily worship, you might like to reflect on these daily readings from the book of Ruth: 1v1-17; 1v22 - 2v1-7; 2v19 - 3v5; 3v14 - 4v6; 4v13-22.

Leader: To open doors, dispel fears,


establish friendships, reveal what is in us,

Evening worship: Sunday 4th August Service of Quiet

We come together not so much to share words as to share silence. We do this because God is as present in silence as in speech. The silence will last for around twenty minutes.

This will be followed by a brief prayer for others and for members and associates of the Iona Community who are remembered on this day of the month. After the service concludes, people may leave quietly or stay in the Abbey church, which will remain lit for a short while.

Leader: Ever listening,


ever watchful,

Evening worship: Monday 5th August Service of Peace, Justice & Integrity of Creation

This evening, we draw on the that part of the Iona Community's Rule which is a commitment to justice, peace and the integrity of creation.

We celebrate that God will for the world peace with justice, known in the Middle East as 'Shalom' or 'Salaam'. This is not an abstraction or something only possible in another world or eternity, but a real hope for this place and time. This justice is proclaimed by the Law and the Prophets and is embodied in Jesus. It flows from the simple fact that God loves the world. When what God loves is threatened, those who love God cannot remain neutral.

ALL: your kingdom come, O God,


your will be done!

Evening worship: Tuesday 6th August Service of Prayers for Healing

Throughout this Service, we will read the Leaders text in Dutch; the responses will be in English, our common language. The responses are in bold.

We come to you, for you come to us in Jesus, and you know by experience what human life is like.

We komen met ons geloof en met onze twijfels, we komen met onze hoop en onze vrees. We come with our faith and with our doubts; welcome with our hopes and with our fears.

We komen zoals we zijn, omdat U ons uitnodigde, omdat U beloofde ons nooit de rug toe te keren.

Scripture reading and short reflection Mark 2: 1-12.

When Jesus returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that he was at home. So many gathered around that there was no longer room for them, not even in front of the door, and he was speaking the word to them. Then some people came, bringing to him a paralyzed man, carried by four of them. And when they could not bring him to Jesus because of the crowd, they removed the roof above him, and after having dug through it, they let down the mat on which the quadriplegic lay. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the quadriplegic, "Child, your sins are forgiven." Now some of the scribes were sitting there questioning in their hearts, "Why does this fellow speak in this way? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?" At once Jesus perceived in his spirit that they were discussing these questions among themselves, and he said to them, "Why do you raise such questions in your hearts? Which is easier: to say to the quadriplegic, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Stand up and take your mat and walk'? But so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins"—he said to the quadriplegic— "I say to you, stand up, take your mat, and go to your home." And he stood up and immediately took the mat and went out before all of them, so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this!"

Toen Jezus enkele dagen later terugkwam in Kafarnaüm, werd het bekend dat Hij weer thuis was. Er stroomden zo veel mensen toe dat er zelfs voor de deur geen plaats meer was, en Hij verkondigde hun Gods boodschap. Er werd ook een verlamde naar Hem toe gebracht, die door vier mensen gedragen werd. Omdat ze door de menigte niet bij Jezus konden komen, haalden ze een stuk van het dak weg boven de plaats waar Hij was. En toen ze een opening hadden gemaakt, lieten ze de verlamde op zijn slaapmat naar beneden zakken. Toen Jezus hun geloof zag, zei Hij tegen de verlamde: 'Mijn kind, uw zonden zijn u vergeven.'

Er zaten ook een paar schriftgeleerden tussen de mensen, en die dachten bij zichzelf: 7Hoe durft Hij dat te zeggen? Hij slaat godslasterlijke taal uit! Wie kan zonden vergeven dan God alleen? 8ezus wist meteen wat ze dachten en dus zei Hij: 'Waarom denkt u zoiets? Wat is gemakkelijker, tegen een verlamde zeggen: "Uw zonden zijn u vergeven" of: "Sta op, pak uw mat en loop"? Ik zal u laten zien dat de Mensenzoon volmacht heeft om op aarde zonden te vergeven.' Toen zei Hij tegen de verlamde: 'Ik zeg u, sta op, pak uw mat en ga naar huis.' Meteen stond hij op, pakte zijn mat en ging weg. Alle mensen zagen het; ze stonden versteld en loofden God. 'Zoiets hebben we nog nooit gezien,' zeiden ze.



An Act of Commitment

We are here because Jesus calls us. Jesus is not neutral about those he loves. He does not want them simply to bask in his generosity, but to discover depths and potentials within themselves that are only found through commitment.

Jesus calls us to be committed to his person, because it was to relate personally to humanity that he came. But he also invites us to be com- mitted to a style of life which represents on earth the qualities of heaven.

And Jesus calls us to a purpose: the redemption of all things – social, polit- ical, personal and religious – in accordance with the revealed will of God.

In this service, we are given the opportunity to recommit ourselves to Jesus and the purposes of God's kingdom. This may happen in a variety of ways, some of which may involve moving within the church. Such active engagement enables prayer in ways different from simply using words; however, it is always optional, and to remain seated and make a personal commitment is equally appropriate.





Suggested readings for Community Week 2024

We offer this sequence of readings to guide our reflections during Community Week. Taking the view that the experience of migration and being refugees is more about 'us' than it is about 'them', these readings trace this theme through the experience of the people of God as borne witness to in the Law, the Prophets, the Psalms, the Gospels and the Epistles.

Monday

A reading from the Law: Deuteronomy 26 v 1-11

When you have entered the land the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance and have taken possession of it and settled in it, take some of the first fruits of all that you produce from the soil of the land the Lord your God is giving you and put them in a basket. Then go to the place the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his Name and say to the priest in office at the time, "I declare today to the Lord your God that I have come to the land the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us." The priest shall take the basket from your hands and set it down in front of the altar of the Lord your God. Then you shall declare before the Lord your God: "My father was a wandering Aramean, and he went down into Egypt with a few people and lived there and became a great nation, powerful and numerous. But the Egyptians mistreated us and made us suffer, subjecting us to harsh labour. Then we cried out to the Lord, the God of our ancestors, and the Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, toil and oppression. So the Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with great terror and with signs and wonders. He brought us to this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey; and now I bring the firstfruits of the soil that you, Lord, have given me." Place the basket before the Lord your God and bow down before him. Then you and the Levites and the foreigners residing among you shall rejoice in all the good things the Lord your God has given to you and your household.

Tuesday

A reading from the Prophets: Jeremiah 29 v 1-7

This is the text of the letter that the prophet Jeremiah sent from Jerusalem to the surviving elders among the exiles and to the priests, the prophets and all the other people Nebuchadnezzar had carried into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon. (This was after King Jehoiachin[a] and the queen mother, the court officials and the leaders of Judah and Jerusalem, the skilled workers and the artisans had gone into exile from Jerusalem.) He entrusted the letter to Elasah son of Shaphan and to Gemariah son of Hilkiah, whom Zedekiah king of Judah sent to King Nebuchadnezzar in Babylon. It said: This is what the Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, says to all those I carried into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: "Build houses and settle down; plant gardens and eat what they produce.



Marry and have sons and daughters; find wives for your sons and give your daughters in marriage, so that they too may have sons and daughters. Increase in number there; do not decrease. Also, seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the Lord for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper."

Wednesday

A reading from the Psalms: Psalm 137

- 1 By the rivers of Babylon we sat and wept when we remembered Zion.
- 2 There on the poplars we hung our harps,
- 3 for there our captors asked us for songs, our tormentors demanded songs of joy; they said, "Sing us one of the songs of Zion!"
- 4 How can we sing the songs of the Lord while in a foreign land?
- 5 If I forget you, Jerusalem, may my right hand forget its skill.
- 6 May my tongue cling to the roof of my mouth
- if I do not remember you,
- if I do not consider Jerusalem my highest joy.
- 7 Remember, Lord, what the Edomites did on the day Jerusalem fell.
- "Tear it down," they cried,
- "tear it down to its foundations!"
- 8 Daughter Babylon, doomed to destruction, happy is the one who repays you according to what you have done to us.
- 9 Happy is the one who seizes your infants and dashes them against the rocks.

For the realness of these emotions. For the uncomfortable truth they tell. That your love is stronger than hate. Thanks be to God.



Thursday

A reading from the Gospels: Matthew 2 v 13-23

When they had gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. "Get up," he said, "take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him."

So he got up, took the child and his mother during the night and left for Egypt, where he stayed until the death of Herod. And so was fulfilled what the Lord had said through the prophet: "Out of Egypt I called my son."

When Herod realized that he had been outwitted by the Magi, he was furious, and he gave orders to kill all the boys in Bethlehem and its vicinity who were two years old and under, in accordance with the time he had learned from the Magi. Then what was said through the prophet Jeremiah was fulfilled:

"A voice is heard in Ramah, weeping and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children and refusing to be comforted, because they are no more."

After Herod died, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who were trying to take the child's life are dead."

So he got up, took the child and his mother and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning in Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. Having been warned in a dream, he withdrew to the district of Galilee, and he went and lived in a town called Nazareth. So was fulfilled what was said through the prophets, that he would be called a Nazarene.

Friday

A reading from the Epistles: 1 Peter 2 v 9-12

But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy. Dear friends, I urge you, as foreigners and exiles, to abstain from sinful desires, which wage war against your soul. Live such good lives among the pagans that, though they accuse you of doing wrong, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day he visits us.





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
