PROGRAMME OUTLINE/TIMES

We will be following the pattern of our 6-day gatherings at lona Abbey. Guests are welcome to arrive any time from 16:00 on Saturday 3rd August. The evening meal will be served at 18:00. Community Week will close after breakfast and morning worship on Friday 9th August. A more detailed programme will be sent out in advance.





During the week we will

- Worship together and spend time in prayer and stillness
- Share input and reflection from experts on our theme
- Meet in small groups threaded throughout the week to provide stability and a common 'home'
- Tours of the Monastery
- Hear 'Member Stories'
- Free time and time to enjoy Erfurt
- Day trips ('pilgrimage') within the local community
- Living in community in the medieval monastery that was home to Martin Luther in the heart of southern Germany
- There will be various ways of connecting online during the week – more information to follow

A NOTE ABOUT LANGUAGE

While English will be the primary language of the week together, we will also be sensitive to the various language needs in our group. The planning group is exploring options including

- Translation in advance of some key ideas and themes
- Multi-lingual worship
- Informal simultaneous translation as needed
- Single-language small groups
- Pre Community Week language tutorials





PARTICIPANTS

Community Week 2024 is open to Members and Associate Members of the Iona Community, including our Young Adult Members. We are also delighted to be welcoming some guests from Oikosnet Europe who will join us for part of our time together.

VENUE

We will be staying in the Evangelical Augustinian Monastery, Augustinerstrasse 10, 99084 Erfurt, Germany. This former monastery, built from 1277, is where Martin Luther lived between 1505 and 1511. Part destroyed in 1945, the monastery was restored in the early 2000s and now is a place for quiet, retreat and reflection offering office facilities for church bodies, conference space, a space for stillness and reflection, and a library.





COST

- full fee 766 Euros (£660.00) per person
- reduced fee 383 Euros (£330) per person applicable if ...
 - o you are a student in full-time education
 - you are a child aged between 5 and 15 at the start of the event
 - your only income is from state benefits or a state pension
 - you are paid beneath the real living wage (the UK Living Wage is £12.00/hour. The London Living Wage is £13.15/hour for 2023–24)
 - you are homeless, a refugee, or an asylum seeker
- Children under 5 at the start of the event are free
- These costs and reductions are slightly less than what we charge for staying for 6 nights at Iona Abbey in 2024.
- Prices include all meals and accommodation

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION POLICY

- A non-refundable deposit of 25% is required at the point of confirmation
- Our full cancellation policy will be sent at the point of confirmation
